
















Storytelling sessions




Durga Puja celebration

01.12.2020-07.12.2020



21.12.2020-23.12.2020



Delhi Public School Howrah, on the 30th of January 2021 organized an online webinar titled "EVERY MIND MATTERS- A DISCOURSE ON MENTAL HEALTH". Mental health has always been a relevant topic but one that was neglected for long. With the pandemic overturning lives, discussions on mental health have become the need of the hour. The objective of this webinar was to make way for young minds to start these very discussions.

The webinar welcomed 3 eminent guest speakers, Senior Psychiatrist Dr. Debasish Ray, Psychologist and Counselor Dr. Amitabh Mohan and Mr. Bhavin Shah, Executive officer, Education World. The guest speakers shared their viewpoints on very relevant topics which were a great source of information for the participants and viewers.

To allow our youth to share their views on various topics related to mental health, the webinar hosted 13 participants from India, U.K and UAE.

The participants and the topics they discussed were-

- 1. Sohan Das from Haberdasher Boys School, England discussed the Need to normalize mental health
- 2. Eshan Banerjie from Birla High School Kolkata discussed the Need to educate men about menstruation
- 3. Debopriya Sarkar from DPS Ruby Park Kolkata picked the topic -Is Corona phobia a greater threat than Corona itself? Mental health and it's relation to physical health and immunity.
- 4. Sunidhi Sudhir from DPS E city, Bangalore spoke on the Threat of Pseudo- specialists- Need for certification and qualifications.

- 5. Teesta Sarkar from BDMI Kolkata spoke about Loneliness amongst the elderly (the effects of technology and the pandemic).
- 6. Adiptya Ghosh from DPS Howrah discussed Social Distancing vs Physical Distancing (understanding the effects of the pandemic on interpersonal relationships).
- 7. Ishan Sarkar from Kimbolton School, U.K spoke on the mental well-being of people working in Hospitals.
- 8. Durba Ghosh of Shri Shikshayatan School, Kolkata decided to speak on the need of taking care of mental health from an early age. Increase in Depression in Adolescence and Young Adults.
- 9. Muskan Dhankar of DPS Pataudi decided to discuss Dealing with the fast pace of life and its effects on mental health.
- 10. Tanushree Nag from Nonsuch High School, U.K. spoke about the Effects of Social Media on Personality Development, how important is a digital detox?
- 11. Ayush Biswas from Presidency School (Kasturi Nagar) spoke on the Effect of Pop culture on mental health
- 12. Md. Abdul from DPS Ajman, UAE, selected the topic Stereotypes associated with mental health of men.
- 13. Disha Prattipati of DPS Bangalore spoke on what can we do to take care of the mental well-being of the ones around us? Media and its effect on development of Empathy.


Art Integrated Project under 'Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat Programme'

The Art Integrated Learning was an initiative by CBSE with the aim to make learning more interesting, and joyful by tapping the creative side of the children. One of the objectives of AIL was to make the students aware of the vast and diverse cultural heritage of the country.

Students from classes I to XII participated in making variety of projects ranging from art to research. The topic of the AIL was 'Collaborative study of Ladakh and West Bengal' and the children got a chance to integrate subjects like English, Math, E. V. S, Science, Hindi/Bengali, Dance, Music and Art/ Craft in their projects.

The projects focused on the comparative study of the two states - their projects and activities included research on cuisines, climate, economy, festivals and landforms of these two places. They prepared recipe books, travel brochures, advertisements for tourism, role play on mask festival, wrote dialogues and stories, climate graphs and even recorded and compared sunset and sunrise timings in Kolkata and Ladakh. etc. They also made hand prayer wheels, chart on the festivals of Ladakh, wrote poems on Ladakh, learned about different dance forms and musical instruments, etc. Children indeed enjoyed learning amidst so much of creativity.

Global connects

Climate Action Project

Dates of the project- 28th September -8Th November 2020

Number of students participated: 24 (selected students from classes (V-VIII)

The Climate Action project aims to change students' behavior and societies' mindset concerning climate change and environmental threats through education. It is a student-centered project - a 6 weeks journey involving more than 2.5 million students across 135 countries. It is supported by governments in 15 countries. It is in collaboration with WWF and NASA, and endorsed by Jane Goodall, President Higgins, Kumi Naidoo, scientists and public figures. It was covered by media across 45 countries including BBC, CNN and National Geographic

Delhi Public School, Howrah had joined the Climate Action Project 2020, a global initiative to combat climate change. Through participation in the project students learnt values and attributes such as-collaboration, creativity, empathy, critical thinking and problem solving.

The project started with an orientation programme for the children to discuss the rules and regulations and format of the project that was undertaken. Smaller meetings were held each week on Saturdays over a period of six weeks to discuss the plan layout for the forthcoming week.

A brief overview of the project is discussed in the subsequent paragraphs.

Week 1

Introduction:

- What is climate change what would be your definition?
- What is causing climate change locally?



We initiated the programme by searching for the underlying causes of climate change and prepared the longest list possible outlining the natural as well as the anthropogenic causes, followed by preparation of posters with captions .To add on we also explained on how these causes have effected and added to the climate change through a video presentation.

Week 2

- What are the effects of climate change?
- Launch #planted (global tree planting)



The following week, we worked on the effects that climate change has imprinted on the flora, fauna, human lifestyle and weather patterns. In addition to the preparation of the list of effects, children also wrote their own poetry to bring out the consequence of climate change. They also conducted surveys and interviews by preparing questionnaires and conversed with their seniors regarding the changes visible in the climate pattern and comparing the climate with the yesteryears. Furthermore, students took part in the #plantED, a global tree planting activity to contribute their bit in stabilizing the environment and revert it from damage.

Week 3

- What are its causes and effects globally?
- Are there any other **Environmental Issues** (pollution, water, biodiversity, etc)?
- Students **connect** with peers in other schools/countries.

Climate action in a global scenario was the main focus of this week. Through the techniques of mapping, children connected and linked places facing similar disruption in flora, fauna, human lifestyle and weather patterns as a cause and effect of climate change. They also watched and witnessed different causes and effects of climate change across the continents and apprised the glaring effects of climate change.

Week 4

• What are potential solutions for climate change and/or specific environmental issues?



This week focused on the solutions to climate change. Apart from listing out the possible solutions students also created a web chart of their own solutions outlining the advantages and list of materials required to prepare the same. Some of the students came up with their own home made unique solutions like mini home biogas from kitchen waste, on plastic eating enzymes (recycling plastic), homemade dye etc.

We also had an interesting and insightful session with a student mentor from Singapore, Ms.Hila Davies. She praised the work our children have put up as well as shared her knowledge and expertise in addressing the questions related to climate action as raised by our students. She was also kind enough to discuss about the recent scenario in Singapore with regards to climate change awareness and actions.

Week 5

Webinar with speakers from NASA, WWF, UN and students

On 5th November 2020, students and teacher in charges were a part of the webinar conducted by the Climate action team in collaboration with NASA, WWF, UN and students across the globe.

Each student penned down their own pledge to protect the environment and then shared with their friends as a resolution and a goal to be achieved.

Week 6

To conclude the project, children made an application on causes, effects and solutions including the ones in the news to be able to present to everyone and enlighten them. In addition we also brought in Mr.Sambuddha Mukherjee, a geologist from the Geological Survey of India to share his thoughts, ideas and insights on how climate change and geological processes are intertwined. He concluded the session with an interaction with our students.
