Academic Report 2023

Pre - Primary Section

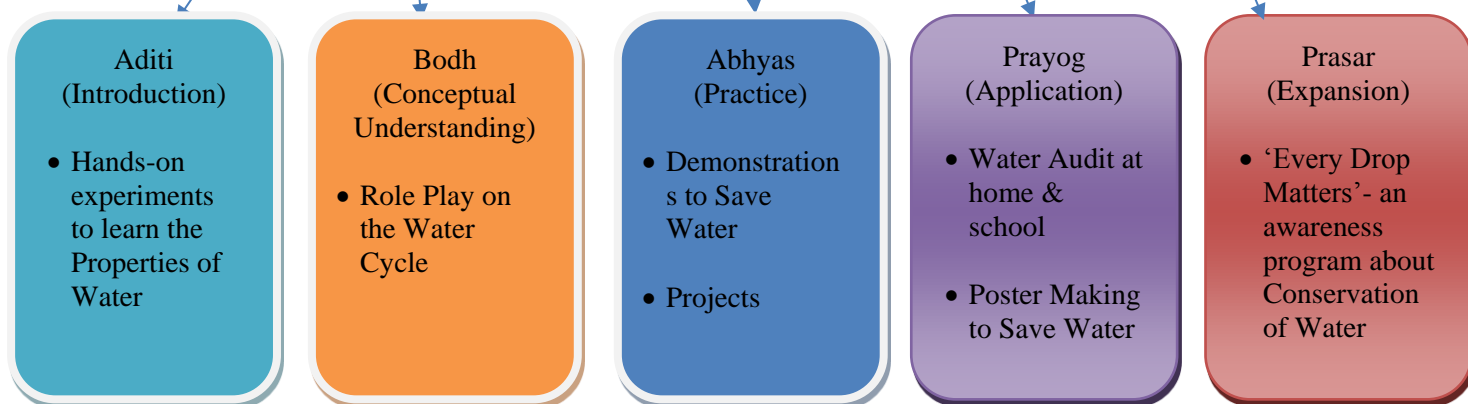
The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has suggested 5+3+3+4 curricular and pedagogical structure, the first five years in a student's life is considered to be very important as the education and care during this period lays the foundation for further acquisition of knowledge. According to this structure, the early period of development of a child starts from the Nursery and continues till Class II. We focus on the student's physical and motor, cognitive, socio-emotional-ethical, cultural/artistic, communication and early language, literacy, and numeracy development skills through numerous hands on activities.

Acquisition of Foundational Literacy and Numeracy in early grades has always been an important part of our academic curriculum in which we aim to enable all children to read and respond with comprehension, independently write with understanding, develop number sense, mathematical thinking, problem solving and reasoning.

- Alignment of Curriculum Content with the **Panchakosha** concept of NEP 2020:
 - **Annamaya Kosha & Pranamaya Kosha:** Yoga & Meditation Sessions, Sensorial Activities, teaching healthy habits & hygiene, sharing healthy Food Chart, etc, are practiced for the **Sharirik** and **Pranik Vikaas** of students.
 - **Manomaya Kosha & Vijnanamaya Kosha:** **Mansik** and **Bauddhik Vikaas** are ensured by providing opportunities to observe & explore, leading to the enhancement of their imagination and creativity. Through Role Plays, Storytelling Sessions, Puppet Shows, etc, students are guided to handle their emotions in the positive manner.
 - **Anandamaya Kosha:** To ensure their **Chaitisik Vikas** the Gayatri Mantra & Saraswati vandana are recited in the morning assembly and they are made aware of the significance of the same. Celebrations like Saraswati Puja, Durga Puja, Diwali, Christmas, Guru Nanak Jayanti, Ganesh Chaturthi, Rath Yatra, Eid, etc help them to respect the different cultures of India.

Our lessons are planned to provide students with experiential learning as they always learn naturally and choose their pace and terms. Our teaching pedagogy and curricular goals are planned according to the NEP 2020 guidelines. The **Panchaadi** – a five step learning process is followed while planning the curricular goals: **Aditi** – Introduction, **Bodh** –Conceptual Understanding, **Abhyas** – Practice, **Prayog** – Application and **Prasar** – Expansion.

- Our teaching pedagogy includes outdoor play, imaginative play, creative play, music and dance, art, exploring nature and the environment that provides experiential learning as the best way for children to learn is through experience.
- Students experience hands-on activities such as Colour Days, Mango-ficent Day, Plant A Seed activity, Community Helpers Day, Farm to the Fridge activity, Mango-ficent Day, Pet Show, etc to strengthen their understanding of the themes.
- Fun – Task-Tic Hour activities such as Earth Day, Beat the Heat, Art Attack, Quizholic, Kathakar, etc, are conducted twice a month to identify and nurture their innate talents. Efforts of the best participants are acknowledged with Certificates.
- Intra-Class and Inter House Quiz Competitions are conducted to enhance their general awareness and critical thinking.
- Life Skills activities such as using Golden Words, expressing gratitude, Be a Secret Santa, Hand in Hand with our Helpers, donating stationery items on birthdays to the orphanage, Electricity & Waste Audit, reading stories on Indian Mythology & Culture enable them to grow up to be responsible citizens.
- Surbhi - Vernacular Recitation & Storytelling Competition, Tell a Tale, Choral Recitation, Class Assemblies, Special Assemblies, Celebration of Important Days, etc ensure participation of every student and increase their exposure to application of their learning through expressions.
- Students with academic concerns are provided with Remedial Classes to clarify their doubts.
- Students with special needs are guided by the School Counselor and the Special Educator regularly. Teachers are also sensitized about the needs of such students.
- Teachers attend workshops regularly by CBSE, DPSS – HRDC and other resources to enhance their skills.
- Microteaching sessions are conducted frequently in the Pre – Primary Department to empower the teachers through peer learning.

Learning Extensions

- The **English Programme**, divided into 5 levels according to the age groups, ensures the development of the language through a variety of well planned activities and exercises. We have been following **Wings of Words Series (WOW)** by Stones2Milestones from classes Nursery to II with the objective of making the students confident in English. A lot of stress is given the enhancement of the **listening, speaking, reading** and **writing** skills of the students.
- The programme also provides a mobile application for the parents called '**Freedom**' that aids the parents to develop the habit of reading at home through various activities, Quiz, short stories, interesting news headlines, animated movies, etc. Regular training sessions are conducted to induct the parents in the programme.
- The activities in the homeroom environment are based on the phonetic approach of letters, connecting letters to pictures; guess the object, picture telling, role play, flashcard interaction, active listening games and exercises.
- After the introduction of the phonetic sounds and new words, word lists for the same are shared with the parents to enhance their vocabulary and reinforce the concepts.
- Organic Reading is practiced in the class and the same sound / word / sentence is sent home and students are encouraged to display it and read them regularly at home.
- Students of Classes KG II – II are being sent 15 words (KG II) and paragraph (I - II) weekly to copy and write it in the practice worksheets. This helps enhance their letter formations, pace & quality of work them and ensures the development of their reading skill along with the quality of work.
- We follow the **CPA** method to build the numerical concepts of the students during the classes.
 - **C - Concrete**
 - **P - Pictorial**
 - **A - Abstract**

For the problem solving lessons the four steps are followed. They are:

- **U – Understanding**
- **P – Plan**
- **A – Answer**
- **C - Check**



UPAC process helps to build good habits for approaching mathematical problems of any difficulty. It helps the students to develop their problem solving skills, logical reasoning and deducting skills. Students are also assisted to learn numerical concepts through integrated activities to give them firsthand experience about the concepts such as Non Fire Cooking on Shapes, Tangram Puzzles, etc.

- Projects serve the purpose of enhancing the ability of the students to conduct research, collect information, sort it into categories and present it in their own way. They are provided with well-planned **integrated projects** that serve the purpose of increasing their awareness about the social as well as environmental causes, develop the interpersonal skills of students, etc. Multiple subjects are being integrated using a common theme for the Projects.


- **Campus Care**, an artificially intelligent school management software and mobile app, is used by the school that helps to connect parents, teachers, principal and the management on a single platform. It enables the teachers to upload the study materials, assignments, weblinks, circulars, etc, on a daily basis which can be easily accessed and followed by the parents.
- Using **brainteasers**, **riddles** and **tongue twisters** during the classes, help children to interact, enhance their vocabulary, improve pronunciation and fluency, develop their thinking skills, etc. It also makes the teaching learning process fun filled sessions and gives the students an opportunity of self-learning, learning from peers, etc. It also helps the teachers to analyze the level of language of individual children.
- Students take an **environment pledge** every day in the morning in which they promise to plant more and more trees for a healthy life. This pledge has been composed with the motto to make the children aware of the importance of trees and their role in the environment.

READING AND LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT


WINGS OF WORDS: ENGLISH PROGRAM

-  This English Teaching Programme is divided into 5 levels and aims at enhancing the 4 skills - Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing using interactive activities based on the level of the children.
-  Access to the Freedom App for parents also makes this programme beneficial and easy to use.


REPORTER OF THE WEEK

-  Every week after the prayer, a new student gets to share the headlines of the day.


CHITTER CHATTER BOX

-  Encouragement of conversation using objects known to the students.


RRE (RHYME-READING-CONVERSATION)

-  15 minutes of Rhymes, reading & conversation daily enhances their Language skills & vocabulary.


PUPPET SHOWS

-  Utilizing the art of puppetry while teaching makes lessons enjoyable and learning becomes long lasting.


RHYME AND RECITATION INTRA – SCHOOL & INTER SCHOOL COMPETITION

-  The competition helps the students enhance their rhythmic skills and self confidence.


CELEBRATING READING

-  Celebrating 'World Book Day' & 'National Reading Day' to create awareness about the importance reading and related facts.


ORGANIC READING

-  Development of their ability to read using simple sentences. A sound/word/sentence is introduced by the teacher. Each child gets a slip of the same. Parents are encouraged to pin it on a board at home. This becomes 'sight reading' of sound/word/sentence. Every week a new slip of sound/word/sentence is sent home. This develops the language of the child.


TTJS / TELEKIDS NEWSPAPER

-  Students develop love for reading as well as become aware of the current events.

RIDDLES, BRAIN TEASERS & TONGUE TWISTERS

-  Age relevant riddles, brain teasers & tongue twisters are being shared in the classes to increase student engagement & participation.

INTEGRATED ACTIVITIES

-  Rhymes, Storytelling, Show and Tell Sessions based on themes enhance their vocabulary.

New Innovation and Ideas

- **Reporter of the Week:**

Every week one student is being appointed as the Reporter of the Week to share the headlines of the day before the beginning of the classes daily. This helps to increase the knowledge as well as interest of the students about the current events as well as develop their language skills and self-confidence.

- **Quizzy Buzzers & Quiz Competition:**

As a part of general awareness, students are being sent Quizzy Buzzers (strips) that contain questions and answers on the current events or on general knowledge. Apart from academics students are required to know what is happening in their surroundings and be updated with the past events and as well as the current events.

Intra Class & Inter House quiz competitions are being held to provide students with the exposure of competitive events from a young age as well as arouse in them curiosity to learn new things.

- **Interesting Fact of the Week:**

Every week a new fact is introduced to students keeping in mind their age level so that they gather knowledge about topics other than the ones given in the books. The fact is displayed in one fixed corner of the homeroom for the entire week and then it is changed. It arouses interest in the young learners to look up for information and increase their knowledge.

- **Fact Files:**

Fact files are being regularly depending upon upcoming festivals, days of celebrations, birth anniversaries of prominent personalities, etc. It consists of few interesting facts on a particular topic / theme that will help to arouse their interest and curiosity.

- **HRT Observation Sheets:**

Teachers are maintaining a record of their one to one interactions with both students and parents on individual sheets that will be attached to the Anecdotal Record of students at the end of the session. It includes the mention of any specific point shared by the child / parents, any interaction between the teacher & parents, any award won by the child, etc.

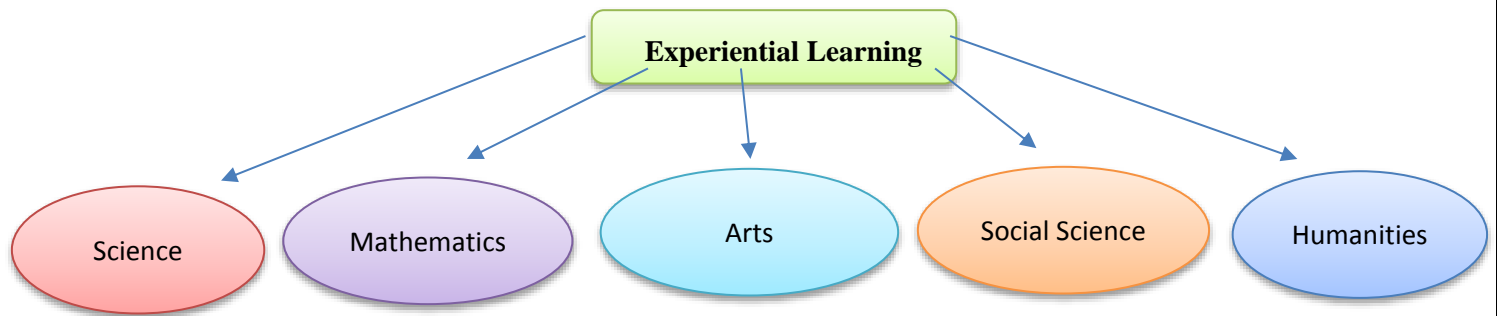
Parents Teacher Interaction

- Orientation for new parents was organized in both online and offline platforms. A parenting session was conducted by the School Counselor through the online mode. Teachers guided the new parents about our teaching methods, activities, rules & regulations of the school.
- Parents from Nursery to KG II were given demonstrations by the teachers to teach Phonic Sounds, correct formation of letters and numbers to ensure that parents are also guiding their wards in the correct way at home.
- **Parent Teacher Interactions** take place regularly to ensure that every child is getting the required care and guidance from both the school and home. Teachers constantly guide the parents whenever they have any queries or doubts.
- Parents of academically weak students are guided regularly by teachers to help them assist them at home properly. They are also asked to be present during the Remedial Classes to observe and follow the same pattern of teaching at home.
- Events like Teej Celebration, Daddy's Day Out, Grandparent's Day, etc are organized to strengthen the bond between parents and the school.

Academic Report

Middle School

- School reopened for in campus classes in full swing on the 4th April 2023 for the middle school classes.
- The classes III to VII fall under the Preparatory(3-5) as per the NEP 2020 where the introduction of Experiential learning across the sciences, mathematics, arts, social sciences, and humanities is done, hence the lesson plan of these classes were designed with integration of themes and Middle Stages(6 & 7) with a subject-oriented pedagogical and curricular style.



- Text Books were selected for the middle school classes that were aligned with the guidelines in the NEP 2020.
- Annual Lesson Plans were designed as always with an approach of Holistic Development of Learners (NEP 2020) by identifying Specific sets of skills and values across domains.
- Annual Syllabus was prepared aligning the NEP guideline -Reduction In Curriculum Content To Enhance Essential Learning And Critical Thinking
- Curriculum content was reduced in each subject to its core essentials, making space for critical thinking and more holistic, inquiry-based, discovery-based, discussion-based, and analysis-based learning.
- The mandated content focuses on key concepts, ideas, applications, and problem-solving.
- Teaching and learning is now being conducted in a more interactive manner, for which teachers have and are undergoing training under CBSE, DPSS- HRDC and other resources.
- Annual Syllabus thus prepared was uploaded in the school official portal for all stake holders, parents, teachers and students ready referral.
- Weekly E diaries, Learning Objectives, work set and Study Materials are provided to all classes through the school portal.
- Positive reinforcements are given in the form of "Amazing Effort" and "Green Auditor" badges on a monthly basis to appreciate students who make a mark in environment and disciplinary awareness initiatives they take. This also motivates others to be sensitive to critical thinking, problem solving and team work on a daily basis.

- Hands-on learning, arts-integrated and sports-integrated subject enrichment activities, story-telling based teaching is integrated thoughtfully mentioned as Experiential Learning in the NEP 2020.
- Introduction of AIoT- DPS Howrah became a ‘tinkering’ school, a leap forward in the growing world of Artificial Intelligence. Students of classes VI and VII have been introduced to AIoT as a compulsory activity so that they can get a first-hand experience in the domain of AI, aligned with the guideline Curricular Integration of Essential Subjects, Skills, and Capacities of NEP 2020.
- Mathematics and computational thinking to be given increased emphasis throughout school years has been reemphasized in NEP 2020- this is given special heed in structuring our curriculum, activities, book selection, compulsory attempt by all students in skill based exams conducted quarterly by Open Door. Opportunities for design thinking is opened during Mathaholics to be conducted in the coming month.
- Class counselling session was organized for the students of class VII, a vulnerable age group, to address the pertinent issue of social media addiction and behaviour changes by HLS. Individual counselling sessions are organized with the school counsellor for students with concern.
- Summer vacation commenced from 13th May 2023. Subject enrichment projects were designed integrating various skill subjects and aligning with the CBSE Art Integrated project outline where our state has been paired with Tamil Nadu.
- Adhering to the Compulsory 15 hours training on skill-based subjects, classes VI and VII will be having upcoming Saturdays as *bagless days* to host different vocational activities.
- 1st round of chapter tests have been conducted to evaluate the teaching learning of the concepts introduced so far, Syllabus for the 1st Periodic Assessments for the middle school and Time Table for the same have also been uploaded through the school portal and class Whatsapp groups.
- Sangam- A Literary Conglomerate- an inter school literary fest for the middle school classes was held to celebrate the power of language; the regional language of our state found flavour in the event of choral recitation.

Parent Teacher Interaction

- Parent Orientation for newly inducted students was conducted on through Zoom.in where an insight to the NEP 2020 was also given along with the regular parenting session by the school counsellor.
- Whatsapp groups -class wise were created for communication with parents for important event updation.
- A mandatory PTI was also conducted for the transition classes III and VI on where restructuring of syllabus aligning with the guidelines of NEP 2020 and other school regulations were communicated and highlighted to the parents.

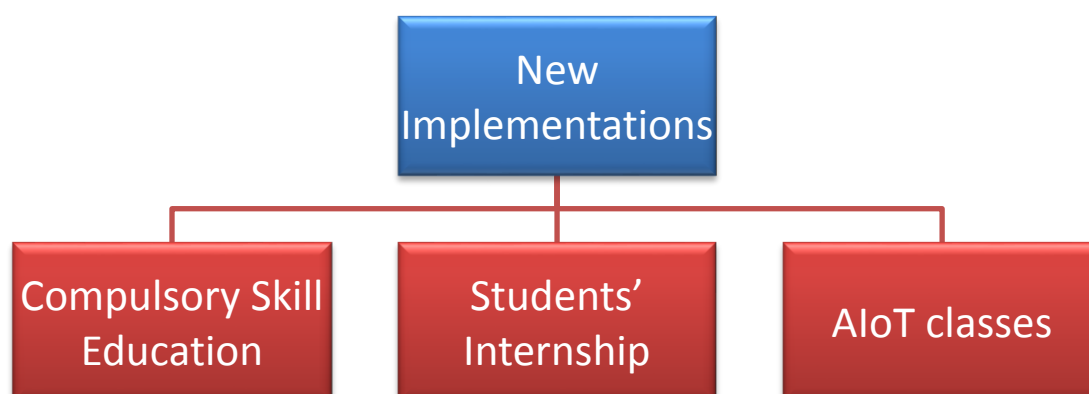

Artificial Intelligence of Things

DPS Howrah finally becomes a tinkering and an experiential learning school with the introduction of AIoT in the science and social science curriculum of classes 6 to 8.

Now topics like Matter, Solid Liquid and Gas, Civilization and its advent, Irrigation, etc. are taught with help of several AI tools, which makes the theoretical topic practically approachable to the students. Teachers have been given special training to integrated these AI based tinkering classes in their regular lesson plan, which makes the desired learning domains even more accessible to the students



- The session commenced for classes IX, X and XII on 27th March 2023, for class VIII on 3rd April 2023 and for class XI on 17th May 2023.
- This year we have the third batch of Class XII.
- The classes commenced through the regular offline mode.
- Study materials and practice sheets are provided to the students regularly through the School Online Portal ENTAB.
- Students are given research based projects, are motivated to make e-portfolios, engaged in debates and discussions, given projects based on critical thinking and encouraged to write Gratitude Journals.
- Teachers regularly attended workshops by DPSS HRDC, CBSE and other renowned agencies. They were specially trained on Online Teaching methods through several workshops. Several in-house workshops were also done by the teachers of the Computer Department.
- Parent Teachers' Meeting for all the classes was held in the regular offline mode.
- Conference call was conducted with the parents of students not showing improvement in their academic performance, in the presence of the class teacher and the HM.
- Class counselling sessions were organized for the students by HLS.
- Individual counselling sessions are organized with the school counsellor for students with concern.
- Career Counselling/ Motivational webinars are organized regularly for the students by different agencies. Stratosphere Education Pvt. Ltd. was one such career counselling company which had organized career counselling seminar in the school
- This year multiple vocational subjects like Artificial Intelligence, Data Science, Financial Marketing, Mass Media, coding, and ECCE etc., are emphasized upon to provide a wide variety of subjects to choose from, following the recommendations of NEP regarding "No Hard Separation" between subjects and its implementation.
- Introduction of AIoT- DPS Howrah became a 'tinkering' school, a leap forward in the growing world of Artificial Intelligence. Students of class VIII have been introduced to AIoT as a compulsory activity so that they can get a first-hand experience in the domain of AI.
- Adhering to the Compulsory 15 hours training on skill-based subjects, the school hosted the first leg of training session in the month of May 2023.
- Summer vacation commenced from 13th May 2023.
- Different academic and non-academic activities planned as per the Annual planner were conducted through the hybrid mode. Few of the activities conducted were Celebration of events like Rabindra Jayanti, Science Mela, Student Council Elections, Social Science Fair, Museum tour, Webinar on current social scenario, Munting sessions, International Yoga day celebration, World Music Day celebration, Father's / Mother's Day celebration, Mathaholics etc.
- All kinds of academic evidences were collected from students of Classes IX -XII in the month of January-February 2023
- Reinforcement classes were conducted for students of Classes X -XII in the month of December 2023, post the Pre-Boards exam, to strengthen the core concepts of the students and also to discuss and analyse the structure of the Pre-Boards Exam question papers.
- The Board Practical Exams for Class XII students were successfully held in the Offline mode in the

month of January.

- Meetings were held with the parents of the weak students of Classes VIII, IX and XI and retests were conducted for these students before promoting them.

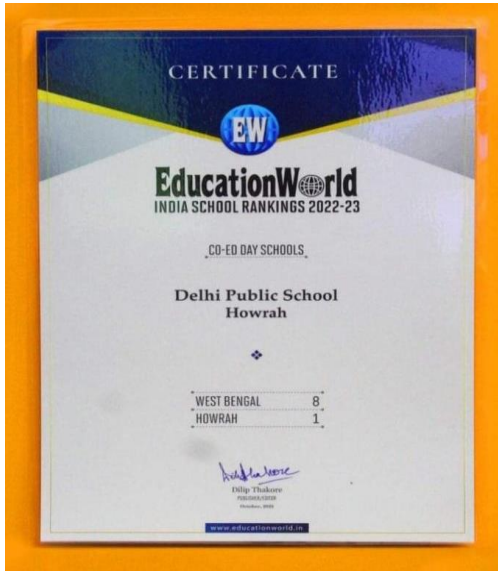
Remedial Classes & Detention Classes

The curriculum is redefined to develop a common understanding for students through a structured system of monitoring students' learning; hence, pedagogical solutions are strategically planned. Based on the detailed analysis of the performances of students, during class hours and the results of the examinations, the students with low-performance rates are identified and provided with **remedial classes**.

The truant students are subjected to **detention classes** as a form of reprehension, in such class special care is taken to understand the need of these students, they are counseled and eventually under the special guidance of the teachers, these students are able to follow up with their regular class works. Such detention classes take place on a regular basis to instill a sense of discipline among the students.

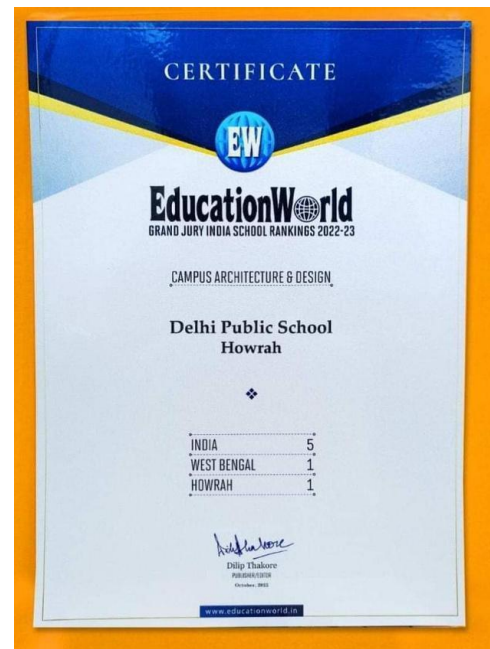

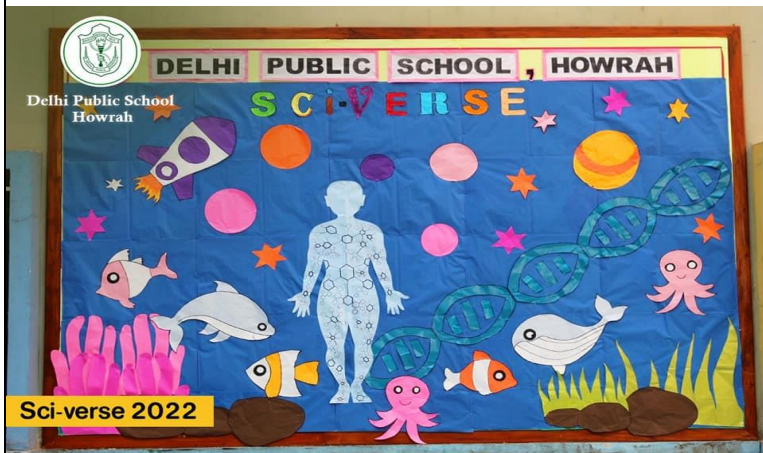
(Science Mela)

Grandparents Day Celebration

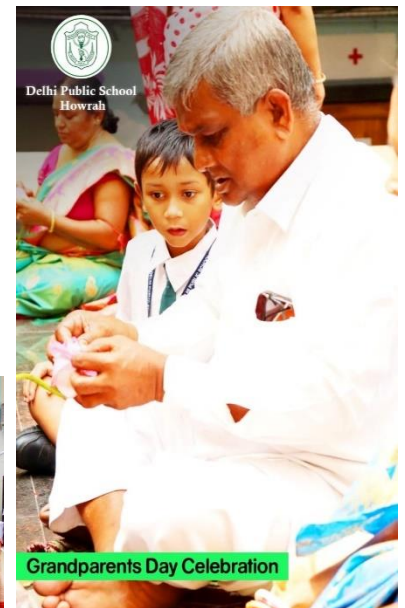
“A grandparent has silver in their hair and gold in their heart.”



NAMAMI GANGE PROGRAMME



- ❁ Namami Gange Programme is an Integrated Conservation Mission, approved as a 'Flagship Programme' by the Union Government in June 2014 to accomplish the twin objectives of effective abatement of pollution and conservation and rejuvenation of National River Ganga.
- ❁ It is being operated under the Department of Water Resources, River Development and Ganga Rejuvenation, [Ministry of Jal Shakti](#).
- ❁ The program is being implemented by the [National Mission for Clean Ganga](#) (NMCG), and its state counterpart organizations i.e State Program Management Groups (SPMGs).
- ❁ NMCG is the implementation wing of [National Ganga Council](#) (set in 2016; which replaced the National Ganga River Basin Authority - NGRBA).
- ❁ It has a Rs. 20,000-crore, centrally-funded, non-lapsable corpus and consists of nearly 288 projects.
- ❁ 120 students were oriented to the Navami Gange Programme through a virtual session conducted by the Ministry of Jal Shakti.
- ❁ They were also made aware of the importance of the preservation of the River Ganges.








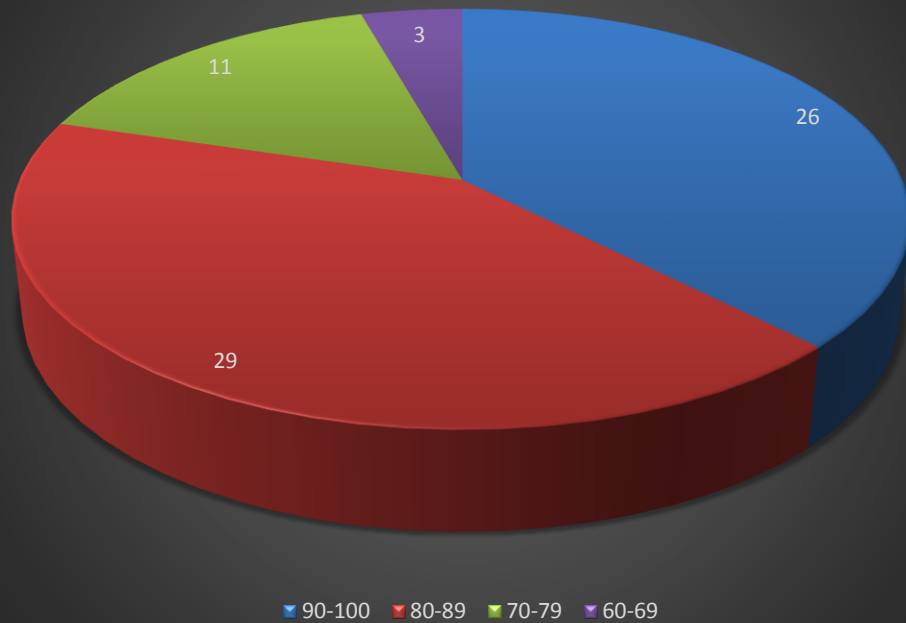

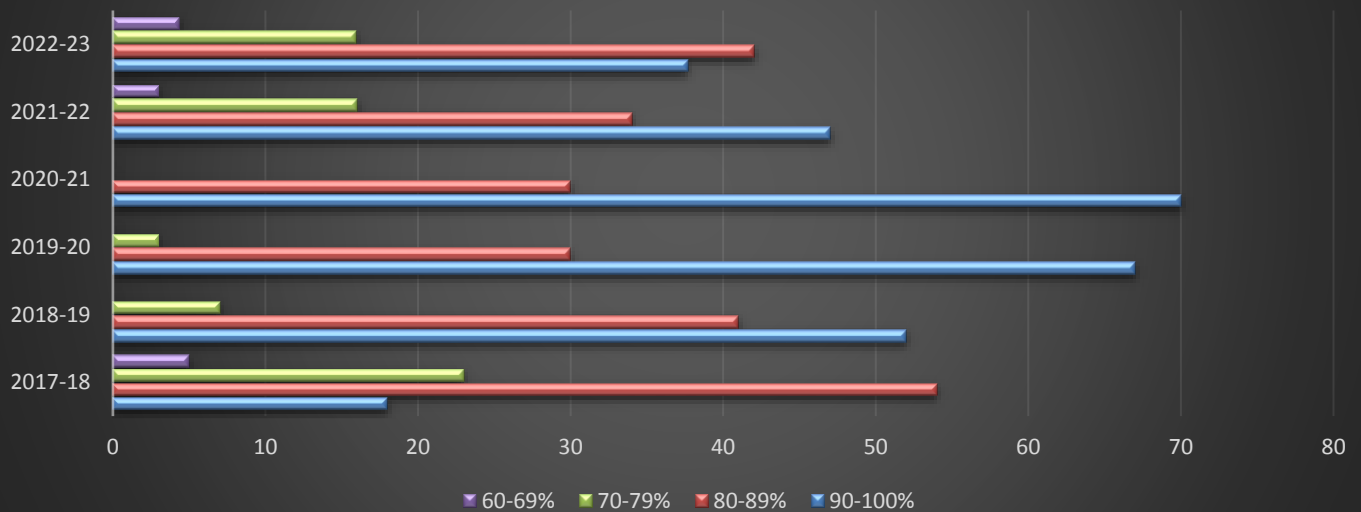

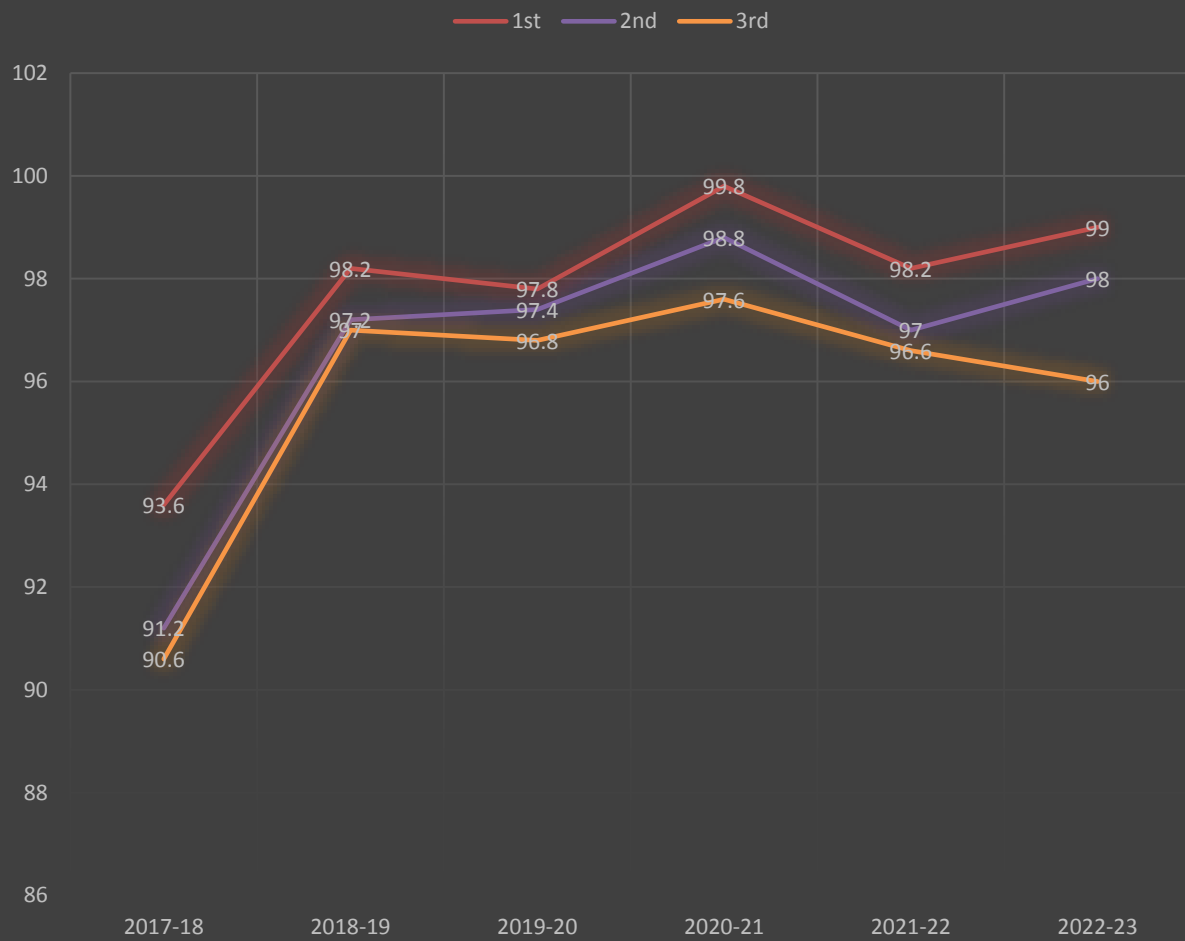
PERFORMANCE OF CLASS X CBSE 2022-23

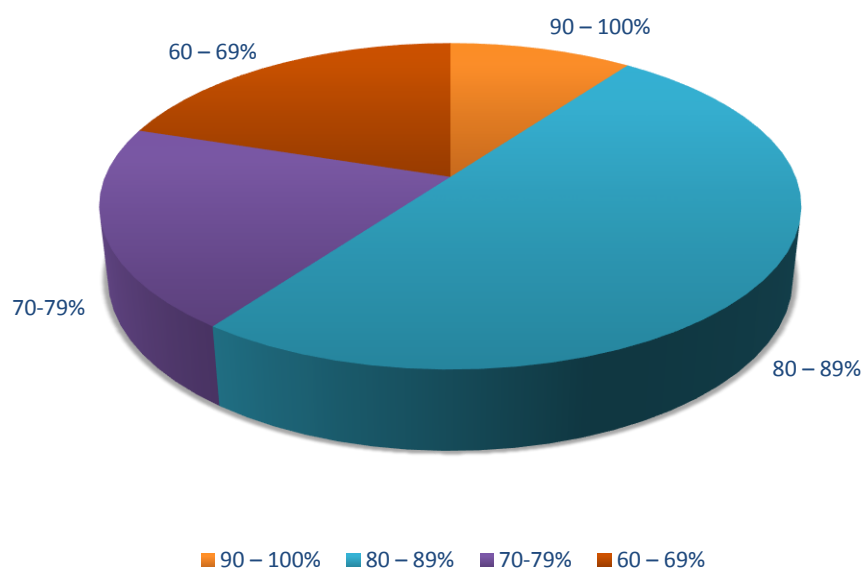

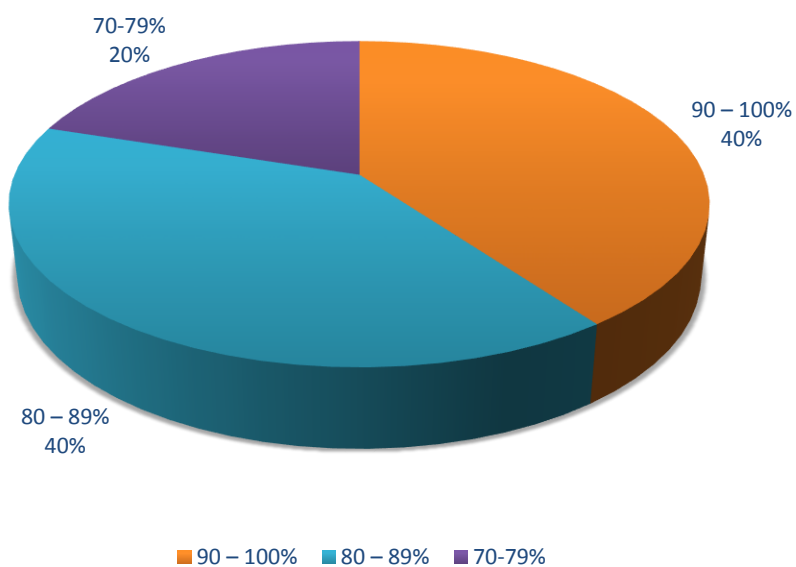
